





DIRECTORY
 OF THE
 COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND,
 FOR 1869-70.

INTRODUCTION.

In laying this volume before the public, it would, perhaps, be too presumptuous to assert that it is wholly free from errors. This could scarcely be safely said of any work of the kind ever published. The compiler contents himself with the statement that no pains or trouble have been spared on his part to secure accuracy, and that whatever errors (if any) may be discovered in the work, they will turn out of a trivial and immaterial character.

The county of Northumberland is situated in nearly the centre of the Province of Ontario. It extends from Lake Ontario, on the south to Rice Lake and the River Trent, on the north, an average distance of about twenty miles. Its eastern boundary is formed by the county of Hastings, while its western is made by the county of Durham; on the south side it is skirted by Lake Ontario, and on the north by Rice Lake, the River Trent, and the county of Peterboro'.

For parliamentary and registration purposes it is divided into two Ridings, the East and the West, the former of which comprises the following municipalities, the townships of Brighton, Cramahe, Murray, Percy, Seymour and the incorporated villages of Brighton and Colborne, while the West embraces the townships of Alnwick, Haldimand and Hamilton, and the incorporated Town of Cobourg. The township of South Monaghan is also connected with the county for municipal, but not for parliamentary purposes. The whole forming part of what is known as the united counties of Northumberland and Durham. Each Riding is represented in the House of Commons, at Ottawa, and in the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, at Toronto, by

one member for each House. The East Riding being represented at Ottawa by Mr. Joseph A. Keeler, of Colborne, and at Toronto by Mr. John Eyre, of Brighton, while the interest of the West is looked after, at Ottawa, by the Hon. James Cockburn, of Cobourg (Speaker of the House of Commons), and at Toronto, by Mr. Alexander Fraser, also of Cobourg.

The municipal government of the county consists of thirty-seven members, elected by the different municipalities of Northumberland and Durham, and composing the body known as the county council. Northumberland is regarded as one of the finest agricultural counties in this section of the Province. Of its area—estimated at 355,860 acres—there are upwards of 203,311 acres cleared and under cultivation. Almost 152,449 acres being under crops, gardens and orchards, and the remainder devoted to pasture, wood and wild lands. The soil mostly is rich, fertile and productive. Large quantities of grain is raised annually, and from its superior quality commands the highest market prices. A large portion of the population, numbering about 45,000, are agriculturalists. There are, however, a number of manufacturers, merchants and traders. The principal manufactures are flour and lumber, but there are also a large number of woollen mills scattered over the county, in which a large business is carried on, among the most important of which I may mention the Ontario Woollen Mills at Cobourg, which give employment to a large number of hands. This county also possesses a large number of churches of various denominations. Large sums are devoted by the different municipalities to the interests of education, and the county possesses some of the best colleges, grammar, and common schools in the Dominion. There are five newspapers published within the county, four at Cobourg, the county seat of the united counties, and one in the village of Colborne, all having a large (and I hope a useful) circulation throughout the county. The county of Northumberland is also remarkable for the number of thriving towns and villages scattered in every direction throughout its length and breadth, and the very small amount of crime committed within its borders.

One great means which must serve most beneficially in the future development of the resources of the county, and advancing its material prospects are its two railroads, combined with the number of fine harbors on Lake Ontario, which forms its southern boundary—with these advantages and aids to the development of its resources and trade, the people of the county of Northumberland—its agricultural and enterprising merchants have good reason to look proud and hopefully to the brilliant future of their fine county.

The village also has a fine general job printing office, under the immediate superintendence of the proprietor, Mr. Peter Begg, a practical printer and engraver.

The education of the youth of both sexes is well looked after by a grammar and a common school, both holding their sessions in a fine brick building erected for that purpose a few years since by the village.

The churches are four in number, as follows:—Church of England (frame); Wesleyan Methodist (brick); Episcopal Methodist (frame); and the Scotch Presbyterian (frame).

CAMPBELLFORD AND EMILYVILLE,

Two villages, the former of which is a post village situated in the township of Seymour, on the east and west banks of the river Trent, which is here spanned by a fine wooden bridge connecting both sections of Campbellford. Emilyville, correctly speaking, is part of or at any rate only forms a suburb to the west portion of the place so I include them as one.

The civil societies of the place are three in number, (viz.,) one Masonic Lodge, (No. 126,) one Orange Lodge, (No. 36,) and one temperance division. The military organizations are one volunteer company and a fine brass band.

Owing to the fine water power imparted by the river, this place is now quite extensively known as a manufacturing town, and on both sides of the river there are several establishments that would do honour to a larger place, among which I may mention a fine large woollen mill, (stone,) employing nearly one hundred hands and turning out a large amount of cloth, flannels, &c., annually. Also on the west side of the river there is another woollen mill, (frame,) and although not as large as the former one it employs a number of hands, and is said to be doing a large and flourishing business, these combined with a large flouring and grist mill, a tannery, a foundry and planing factory, give the place a business importance equalled by few of the inland villages of its size in the Province.

Being the municipal seat of the township, the town Hall, (stone,) is located here, as also a common school house, (stone,) and the following churches : Church of England, (stone,) Roman Catholic, (frame,) Canada Presbyterian, (frame,) and the Wesleyan Methodist, (brick.) The mercantile enterprise of the place is shown by several general stores and hotels, while the mechanical branches are all well represented.

With its fine location, immense water privileges and business enterprise of its inhabitants its future cannot help being one of the most brilliant in this section of the country. Telegraph, post and money order offices. Daily mail, &c. Distant from Cobourg 39 miles, Toronto 109, Montreal 253, and from Brighton, to which place it is connected by daily stage, 21 miles. Population not far from 800.



CASTLETON,

A post village pleasantly situated on the head branch of Cold Creek, in the township of Cramahe. The Colborne and Hastings gravel road also passes through the village. By means of the above named creek, a fine water-power for mills, &c., is furnished to the place, which is improved by A. Y. Dorland, Esq., who has in the immediate vicinity several flour and saw mills, besides stave and shingle works, and a general woollen factory. Messrs. Newcomb & Lapp, have also grist and saw mills in the village, these embrace the manufactories, with the exception of the mechanical representatives. The mercantile business of the place is represented by several general stores, hotels, &c.

Being the Municipal seat of the township, the Council meets in the town hall, (brick) located near the centre of the place. The township Reeve, and Warden of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham for 1870—Dr. C. M. Gould, reside here. The education of the youth is well looked to, in a fine school building, (frame). The civil and military organizations are three in number, as follow: A. L. Orange Lodge, No. 554, and a Good Templars' Lodge, also a Volunteer Infantry Company, No. 8, 40th Battalion, Captain Wm. Duncan.

The churches are three, as follow: Church of England, (frame), Wesleyan Methodist, (frame), and the Episcopal Methodist, also a frame building. The Christian denomination are about to erect a fine brick edifice, and in this connection I may mention that the *Canadian Christian Magazine*, a monthly work under the auspices of the Christian Church, is published here, under the editorial and proprietorship of the Rev. Thomas Garbutt, in connection with a general job printing office. Distant from Cobourg 19 miles, Colborne 7 do. Telegraph and post offices. Daily mail. Population not far from 400.

COBOURG,

An incorporated town, situated in a broad and level valley facing Lake Ontario. It is also on the Grand Trunk Railway, of which it is an important station, and is also the southern terminus of the Cobourg and Peterborough Railway. Although the latter-named railway at present is only used as far as Harwood, a village on Rice Lake, a distance of 12 miles from Cobourg. Being the principle and county town of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham, it contains the usual county buildings, the Gaol, Registry Office, &c. The courts are held in Victoria Hall, a building erected by the town, containing a court-room and several county offices, which will hereinafter be described. This town, in 1859, like several others, separated itself from the United Counties, paying them so much annually for the administration of justice. Distant from Toronto 69½ miles ; Kingston, 91½ ; Montreal, 263½, via Grand Trunk. It has a fine harbour on the lake, from which a large quantity of lumber, grain, iron ore, &c., is shipped yearly to American and other markets, and this trade is said to be constantly on the increase, which argues well for a brilliant future. The town was first settled by Mr. Elias Nicholson, in 1798-9. The first store was opened by Mr. Elias Jones in 1802-3, and the Post Office was established in 1813-14, Mr. James Bethune being the first Postmaster. For some time after the first settlement it was known as Amherst, which was afterwards changed to Hamilton, on account of its being in the township of Hamilton. In 1837, the town was incorporated under a Board of Police, consisting of a president and members, by which the municipal affairs were conducted. The name, in honor of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, was also changed to its present designation. In January, 1850, the management of its municipal affairs was changed from the Board of Police to a Mayor and Board of Councilmen, by which they have since been conducted. The civil societies are represented by one Masonic Lodge, No. 11 ; three Loyal Orange Lodges, Nos. 52, 261 and 961 ; a St. George's, a St. Andrew's, and a St. Patrick's ; also an Agricultural and Horticultural Society. The Fire Brigade consists of two engines and one hook and ladder company, while the military spirit is shown by two Volunteer Infantry Companies, Nos. 1 and 2, 40th Battalion, Captains J. Vance Gravely and W. H. Floyd ; also the Cobourg Garrison Battery of Artillery, attached to the same Battalion, Captain J. H. Dumble.

The manufactures are represented by a woollen mill, a foundry and machine works, two breweries, two grist mills, one saw mill,

several cabinet factories, and others of less note, with the usual number of mechanics.

The streets are wide, well laid out, and lighted with gas, and lined with a number of fine stores and many palatial private residences, while the accommodation of the travelling public is provided for by several fine hotels.

The Bank of Montreal and the Bank of Toronto each have a branch located in this place; both said to be doing a good business. There is also a local institution, known as the Northumberland and Durham Savings Bank, doing business in the place; but as they issue no bills their business is nearly all confined to this immediate vicinity. The educational institutions are, the Victoria College, a Grammar and several Common Schools, besides various private ones located in different parts of the town. The public buildings are, the Victoria Hall, a magnificent building, built of brick, fronted with Cleveland cut stone, erected in 1857, at the cost of nearly \$100,000; containing, besides the various county and town offices, a court room and a large public hall capable of seating about 1000 people; the Registry Office, recently erected of brick and fire proof, at the cost of about \$2000; the Gaol, erected some years since (stone) and used as a court house until the erection of Victoria Hall, and the following churches:—St. Peter's, Church of England (white brick), erected in 1854, cost nearly \$20,000; St. Michael's, Roman Catholic (brick), erected in 1856, cost about \$10,000; St. Andrew's, Presbyterian (stone,) erected in 1834, cost \$4000; Canada Presbyterian (white brick,) erected in 1862, costing about \$20,000; Wesleyan Methodist (brick,) erected in 1852, cost \$12,000; Episcopal Methodist (frame,) erected in 1845, costing \$1000; Congregational (frame,) erected in 1836, cost about \$1400; Baptist (brick,) erected in 1857, cost nearly \$2000; Bible Christian (brick,) erected some years since and cost about \$3200.

There are published four weekly journals in the place, as follow:—The Cobourg *Sentinel*, Daniel McAllister, editor and proprietor; the Cobourg *Star*, W. H. Floyd, editor and proprietor; the Cobourg *Sun*, Thomas McNaughton, editor and proprietor; and the Cobourg *Advertising World*, Henry Hough, editor and proprietor. All of these papers are said to have a good circulation in the surrounding country. The Montreal Telegraph and Canadian Express Company have an Office on King Street. Post Money Order and Savings Bank Office on Division Street. Daily mail. Population about 5000.

COLBORNE,

An incorporated village in the township of Cramahe, situated on the Grand Trunk Railway, 248 miles from Montreal, and 85 miles from Toronto. The Kingston gravel road also passes through the place; connected with Hastings and intervening places by daily stage. Distant from Cobourg, the county town, 15 miles. Was first settled by Mr. Joseph Keeler in the year 1800 or 1801, the first store being opened by his son, Mr. Joseph A. Keeler, in 1815 or '16, and the post-office was established about the same time, he being the first postmaster.

The civil societies of the place are a Masonic Lodge, No. 91; an Orange do., No. 419, and the Colborne branch of the Canada Temperance Reformation Society; also, the E. R. Northumberland Canada Temperance Union.

The manufacturing interests are represented by two grist and one sawmill, a foundry, two tanneries, one planing mill, three cabinet factories, and the usual number of mechanics, while the mercantile interests are looked after by several general stores, hotels, &c.

The village was incorporated as a separate municipality, under a reeve and board of councilmen, in 1858. The East Riding of Northumberland registry office is located in the place—J. M. Grover, Esq., registrar. The village also boasts an excellent local paper, the Colborne *Express*, George Keyes, Esq., being editor and proprietor, which affords, from its large circulation, an excellent advertising medium for the business public both at home and abroad. The schools are a united grammar and common, besides several private ones; the former of which is kept in a fine brick building, erected in 1860 at the cost of nearly \$3,500. The churches are (Trinity) Church of England (frame), erected in 1844, cost about \$2,500; Canada Presbyterian (stone), erected in 1830 or '31, cost at that time nearly \$5,000; Wesleyan Methodist (brick), erected 1862, cost \$4,500; Methodist Episcopal (brick), erected in 1869, costing about \$2,500.

This place during the summer season is very lively, owing to the fact that about all the timber cut in the back part of the Counties of Peterborough and Victoria, destined for Quebec and Montreal markets, passes through the locks in the River Trent, situated at this place, on its way to Lake Ontario, by the string of lakes and rivers intervening between where it is made and the mouth of this river at Trenton, County of Hastings, where it is made up into rafts, and floated or towed down the Bay of Quinté into Lake Ontario, and so on through the River St. Lawrence to the markets above referred to.

The mercantile business of the place is represented by several general stores, groceries, hotels, &c. The Montreal Telegraph Company have lately opened an office in the post office building to supply the wants of the community, especially those of the manufacturers, a large number of which have located along the river on both sides, among which I may mention a flour and gristmill, a sawmill (manufacturing a large amount of lumber annually for American markets), a woollen mill, a cotton factory, a foundry and a tannery. The water privilege possessed by this place gives it communication with all places around Rice Lake, by several small steamers kept constantly plying during the navigable season of the year.

The Masonic Lodge, No. 150; the Orange Lodge, No. 549; the I. O. G. T. Lodge, No. 359, and a youthful temperance organization, known as the Band of Hope, hold regular meetings in the place. There is also a Volunteer Company connected with the 57th Battalion, under the command of Acting Captain H. B. Morton, which meets for drill in a shed erected for that purpose. The schools are two primary ones, with a fair number of pupils in attendance, while the churches, four in number, are as follows:—

Church of England (frame), erected in 1862, at the cost of some \$1200. Roman Catholic (stone), erected in 1864-5, costing about \$10,000. Canada Presbyterian (brick), originally erected in 1856-7, and since improved at the entire cost of about \$3,000. Wesleyan Methodist (brick), erected in 1863, costing about \$2500. Distance from Peterborough, 25 miles; Colborne, 24 miles; Norwood, 7 miles. To all of which places it is connected by stage. Daily mail, &c. Population between 900 and 1,000.

TRENTON,

An incorporated village and port of entry, situated at the mouth of Trent river, on the Bay of Quinté, near its head. The corporation is formed by part of the township of Murray, county of Northumberland, and part of the township of Sidney, county of Hastings. The major portion of the village formally belongs to the township of Murray, but on the first of January, 1853, it was incorporated as a village, and since that period it has formed part of the county of Hastings. During the navigable season of the year, a large business is done here in square timber, as all, or nearly all of the square timber made in the back parts of Hastings, Northumberland, Peterboro' and Victoria counties finds its way, by the various inland lakes and rivers to the river Trent, through which it passes to this place, where it is made up into suitable rafts or cribs for running the lakes and rivers on its way to Quebec. This trade numbers many millions of cubic feet annually, and during the time required for putting it into shape at this place, a large number of men are kept constantly busy, which, at the time, gives Trenton a very large transient population. Besides the square timber, a large quantity of saw logs are brought annually from the back country, which, by the means of several large sawmills situated here, are manufactured into sawed lumber for the various American markets. These interests, combined with gristmills and a foundry, together with several other manufactories, cause Trenton to be known as a town of considerable manufacturing importance to the Province of Ontario. Owing to its favorable location, it also does a flourishing mercantile business with the surrounding country, which, I am informed, is yearly on the increase. The carrying trade of the place having become of such importance a few years since, it was found necessary to establish a line of weekly steamers between this place and Montreal, which, as a paying investment to the proprietors, ranks equally with any of the local inland navigation companies in the Province. These advantages, combined with the enterprise of several of the citizens, will

make Trenton, in time to come, one of the most important villages in this section of the Province.

The Masonic body have two lodges meeting in the place, while the loyal Orange brotherhood, and the Temperance organization, each have one. There is also a military and a fire company in the place.

The education of the youth of the place is not neglected, as will be seen by the number of the schools, which are, a grammar, two common, and a separate one—the latter of which is under the control of the Roman Catholics, to which religious body a large number of the prominent citizens belong; while the literary tastes of the people of the place and surrounding country is attended to by the *Trenton Courier*, a weekly journal having a large circulation, under the proprietor and editorship of Mr. George Young, M.A.

The mercantile business of the place is represented by several general stores, hotels, &c., a few of which would be a credit to any village in Canada. The public buildings are a Town Hall and Market House (stone), erected in 1861, at the cost of some \$3000, and a Drill Shed (wood), erected in 1868, costing nearly \$2000. The churches are four in number, as follows:—The Church of England (stone); the Roman Catholic (frame); the Wesleyan Methodist (frame); and the Canada Presbyterian of the same material as Wesleyan.

With its various natural advantages, enterprise of its citizens, telegraph, express, newspaper offices, and railway connection by the Grand Trunk, combined with its manufacturing interests and fine water privileges, must make the future destiny of this village one of the most brilliant in this portion of the Dominion. Distance from Toronto, 100 miles; Montreal, 233 miles; Cobourg, 32 miles; Belleville, 12 miles. Population within corporation about 1700, but with the surrounding suburbs about 2000.

Northumberland Agricultural Association meets annually here, and at Brighton alternately for exhibition, as well as the township of Percy Agricultural Society, which holds its yearly exhibitions in the place. The place also boasts a volunteer Infantry Company, (No. 9, 40 Bat.), Capt. R. P. Hurlbut.

The Public Buildings are a fine School House (stone), an Orange Hall (frame), and the following churches—a Roman Catholic (frame), a Canada Presbyterian (frame), a Baptist (frame), but not now in use, and two Wesleyan Methodists, one of (frame), and a fine new one of (brick), and the Episcopalians are about to build of brick. Being the municipal seat of the township of Percy, the Township Council and the 8th Division Court holds their sessions in the place.

There is a fine mill-stream passing through the village, which is taken advantage of by furnishing power for the following manufactures: one tannery, a flouring mill, a carding mill and a furniture factory. With a few improvements, this stream might be made one of considerable importance. There are the usual number of mechanical representatives located within the village, and the mercantile spirit is shown by several general stores, hotels, &c., telegraph and express offices. Daily mail each way, north and south. Population not far from 700.
